

Abstract

Kenya. Employing government information conceptual framework and adapting OECD best practices for fiscal transparency in the analysis, the study reveals that comprehensive national budget information in Kenya is publicly available to a very limited extent and that this has implications for fiscal transparency and participation in national budgeting. If comprehensive national budget information is to a larger extent publicly available, national budget transparency can dramatically be improved. This paper, therefore, recommends that the government increases the supply of comprehensive national budget information and create public interest to participate the process.
